

NARRATIVE SUMMARY SOLBERG LAKE ASSOCIATION

Solberg Lake Association was organized in 1981. The articles of Incorporation and ByLaws were accepted by the membership on May 4, 1981. The Association's sole purpose is to preserve Solberg Lake and work together for the betterment of the lake. The primary source of revenue for the Association are the annual dues paid by members. Dues are \$25.00 for families and \$12.50 for single persons. Membership numbers approximately 145 families and/or single persons. The membership year runs from May to May.

There are three general meetings held per year. Officers are elected for a two year term on a rotating basis (i.e., President, Vice President, one delegate elected on year; the following year a Secretary/Treasurer, a second delegate and a Township/ Association Liaison delegate are elected.) Several board meetings are held throughout the year attended by the officers and delegates. Minutes of Board meetings are kept and reported to the general membership at the next general meeting.

The major purpose of the Solberg Lake Association is to protect and improve Solberg Lake. Several projects which have been undertaken include obtaining of a grant to study the lake, its habitat and condition, purchasing and placement of fish cribs at strategic places in the lake (DNR approved), stocking the lake with fish (DNR was contacted concerning types of fish to be stocked; DNR approved), construction of sheltered bulletin boards placed at all public boat landings on the lake (these bulletin boards are used to post messages for all who use the lake, i.e., speed limits, fish limits, lake project survey results, week alerts, etc.), construction and placement of buoys to mark hazardous areas in the lake.

A variety of activities take place on the lake including fishing, pleasure boating, jet skiing, pontooning, enjoying the scenery and on occasion a canoe and sail boat can be spotted.

Solberg Lake Association members strive to improve the lake so that all may enjoy the area now and in the future.
